Environmental Commitment Statement – November 2025

The Environmental Commitment Statement has been updated to comply with DAFI 32-7001 to include specific mission requirements and regional/local environmental concerns.

The Tyndall AFB Checkertail Mission is to develop resourceful and resilient Airmen trained to project unrivaled combat airpower on behalf of the United States of America. Priorities of this mission include: operational readiness, combat-ready airmen, combat-ready support, and resilient Airmen and families. The 325th FW is host to 20 tenant organizations from multiple Major Commands and across several military mission sets located at Tyndall Air Force Base, Fla. The wing is comprised of the 325th Operations Group, 325th Maintenance Group, 325th Mission Support Group and 325th Medical Group. Tenant units include 1<sup>st</sup> Air Force, Air Force Civil Engineer Center, 44<sup>th</sup> Fighter Group, 801<sup>st</sup> Red Horse Training Squadron, Airey NCO Academy, 53<sup>rd</sup> Weapons Evaluation Group, 337<sup>th</sup> Air Control Squadron, and Air Force Office of Special Investigations.

Team Tyndall is fully committed to minimizing the impacts of our operations on the environment and maintaining our excellent reputation for environmental stewardship. Our goal is to sustain mission capabilities while integrating sound environmental practices throughout Team Tyndall operations. Local environmental concerns include occasional noise from aircraft/munitions and impacts to natural, cultural, and water resources. To meet this environmental commitment, all base personnel, including active duty, civilians, contractors, tenants, and visitors, must follow our Environmental Commitment Statement as described below.

**P**romote Environmental Management Systems (EMS) awareness through training

**R**ecycle, prevent pollution, and conserve natural resources

**I**dentify areas for continuous improvement

**D**evelop open communication with the local community

**E**nsure compliance with all environmental laws and regulations
